Powder rooms present an opportunity to make a design statement. They can be the showcase, the jewel box, or the most unexpected room in a home. Because a powder room is small, designers can experiment and splurge on high-end materials without blowing the budget and can let their ideas run wild, using daring patterns or bold colors that could overpower in other parts of the home. 1) The combination of

the floor tile's strong geometric pattern with the simplicity and openness of the washstand creates a dramatic, fresh look. 2) A live-edge wood vanity top, modern vessel sink, and wall-mounted faucet create a balanced modern/rustic contrast. 3) For this powder room in a Mediterranean-style home, the combination of arabesque tile, dramatic wallpaper, and a playful light fixture offers a great example of mixing materials.
